During this meeting, Miss Ashlyn Durel was awarded a check in the amount of \$1,500 as the recipient of this year's SCCCW Rev. William Pentis Memorial Scholarship Award. Ashlyn is from the Beaufort Deanery area and attends St. Gregory the Great Catholic Church. She is a graduate of the John Paul II Catholic School and will attend Charleston Southern University this fall. We congratulate Ashlyn on her many accomplishments and know she will be successful in her future endeavors.

Also, a check in the amount of \$9,946 was presented to Mr. Michael Acquilano, Diocese of Charleston, representing monies collected for the 2019 SCCCW Convention Project—The St. Clare's Home. The Home will be "a place where expectant mothers can live and gain life skills while they are pregnant and for some time after giving birth", said Bishop Robert R. Guglielmone. A 4,000 square foot home sitting on 15.6 acres was purchased by the Diocese in 2018 in Greer, SC. The home will contain 9 bedrooms, 5 bathrooms, and a pool and is expected to open at the end of this summer.

The new 2019-2020 Board of Directors was introduced and is comprised of talented women from all over the state. We thank them for their time and talents in continuing to oversee our mission to support, empower, and educate all Catholic women with Gospel values to the needs of the Church and society and in planning and providing inspiring annual conventions. You can see the complete list of board members on page 15. Make sure to thank the ladies in your deanery for their time and work as the SCCCW board meetings last at least 5 hours with a working lunch, followed by long drives home from Columbia.

Did you know:

- We follow the guidelines set forth by the National Council of Catholic Women (NCCW), headquartered in Washington, D.C., and founded in 1920 under the auspices of the U.S. Catholic bishops.
- The bishops had witnessed the important work done by Catholic women's organizations during World War I and had the wisdom to call for the founding of NCCW to bring these organizations together. This gave U.S. Catholic women a unified voice, a national service program and the ability to reach out to each other through a national organization.
- Most Rev. Emmett M. Walsh, the Sixth Bishop of Charleston, organized the groups throughout the Diocese of Charleston and, on December 19, 1930, the South Carolina Council of Catholic Women (SCCCW) was formed.

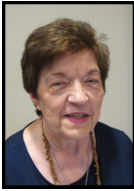

Highlights of Events from the Affiliates of the Beaufort Deanery

Highlights of Events from the Affiliates of the Columbia Deanery

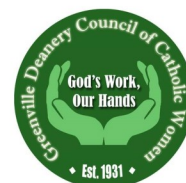
- The members of the **Corpus Christi Women's Group** held a Spring Tea and Fashion Show to support upcoming parish events.

2019 RESOLUTIONS

Resolutions are statements of direction for the SCCCW and its members to use for program planning. A Resolutions Committee submits three resolutions to the SCCCW Board which are then presented to the membership and voted on at the annual SCCCW Convention. The purpose of the resolutions is to create awareness of current issues. Implementation of these resolutions can help guide and create momentum for effective meetings and events throughout the council year.

The resolutions approved by majority vote at the 2019 SCCCW Convention are as follows:

Resolution #1: Healing Divisions

Purpose: To work to heal division in our world; homes, communities, and with government leaders.

Whereas: Divisive voices fill social media, television and other communication venues; generating society's negativity and lack of respect. A lack of response in a positive manner, not only fuels the lack of respect, but is also demeaning to others.

Whereas: In today's world, divisiveness in all levels of society creates an atmosphere that is hostile and destructive.

Whereas: One prayer, one act of kindness, a show of faith and love can result in big changes in our world today.

Whereas: Now is the time to come together as a Christian community to stand up and take responsibility for teaching our young to act in a civil, moral and respectful manner and also to take a stand against negativity and be present in making a difference to build a better future for us all.

Whereas: The South Carolina Council of Catholic Women serves as a source to promote and support individuals with civility in social, economic, cultural, racial and ethical issues within the family, community and government.

Whereas: Jesus calls us to respect the value and dignity of each individual.

Whereas, be it resolved, that the South Carolina Council of Catholic Women acting with faith in conjunction with all of God's people, can be an example of healing divisions with love and respect.

Suggested Actions:

- Pray before responding to a situation or conversation. Evaluate to make sure you understand the issue by researching, Investigating and going back to the original source in a loving manner with humility.
- Improve communication skills to better express exception to ideas without demeaning the individual. Attend workshops or provide workshops on how to speak and communicate with others.
- Contact government leaders to encourage them to work together for the people that they serve with respect and humility. Invite government leaders to speak at meetings or attend meetings where government leaders are present.
- Be an example to those around us!

Resolution #2: The Right to Life

Purpose: To continue and encourage pro-life activities in prayer and in the public square.

Whereas: Our country continues to support Federal law of abortion (Roe vs. Wade). The pro-life movement has made inroads to limit abortion laws in various states. There continues a call to allow for abortion even up to birth including filicide.

Whereas: Science has proven that life begins at conception and as human beings, all have a right to life.

Whereas, be it resolved, that all Christian women join together to pray for forgiveness and a change of heart for all who support abortion.

Suggested Action:

- Encourage members to join in groups or as individuals to pray the rosary for the end of abortion.
- Pray for our representatives at the local, state and federal levels that they have a change of heart and will change the current laws to end abortion.
- Be willing to speak out in the public square to the truth of the evil of abortion.

Resolution #3: The Environment—Plastics

Purpose: Reduce the use of plastic and increase recycling of plastics

Whereas: Most of the world has become part of what our Holy Father, Pope Francis calls, “a throwaway culture” and in the last 70 years, this throwaway culture has resulted in the replacement of other materials with plastic that is either difficult or impossible to degrade in nature;

Whereas: Despite efforts to get people to recycle plastics, we now face a crisis of plastic waste in our oceans with the addition of nearly 10 million tons per year so as to cause damage to marine life and the creation of “plastic soup” at each of the 5 marine gyres in the world as well as unprecedented addition of plastic refuse to landfills; and

Whereas: Less than 50% of the 1 million plastic bottles containing drink water or sodas bought per minute around the world are recycled: therefore be it,

Resolved that the members of the South Carolina Council of Catholic Women advocate for reduction in the use of single use plastic items to include drink bottles and that the members of the South Carolina Council of Catholic Women themselves eliminate or reduce their use of single use plastic items;

Resolved that the members of the South Carolina Council of Catholic Women advocate for an increase in the reuse/recycling of single use plastics;

Resolved that the members of the South Carolina Council of Catholic Women continue to advocate and work for the provision of safe, clean drinking water that is freely available to all persons in all areas of the world; and

Resolved, That the members of the South Carolina Council of Catholic Women unite in prayer so that we may be good stewards for the preservation of the environment of the Earth given us by the Creator.

Suggested Action by the SCCCW Resolution Committee:

- Try to identify the ways in which we can choose reusables, rather than disposables, such as reusable bags, coffee mugs, straws and drinking containers.
- Encourage state government from interfering in counties and municipalities from banning single-use plastic bags.
- Advocate for an increase in recycling of single-use items.
- Provide information awareness workshops to the community.
- Promote and help provide safe, clean drinking water worldwide.

Hints & Tips

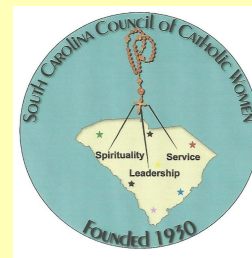
(from the *NCCW Guidance and Resource Manual*)

- **Start each council year with a Planning Meeting.** The main objective is to plan early and to have a written plan so that anyone can execute it. Before beginning your planning process, always begin and end in PRAYER. Remember, a “failure to plan is a plan to fail.”
“Entrust your works to the Lord, and your plans will succeed.” PROVERBS 16:3
- **Choose a theme each council year.** This is a great way to create a cohesive message that can be woven throughout all your programs and activities.
- **Plan a Welcome Back Meeting outlining your goals for the new council year.** Welcome new members and make sure an established member is sitting with them. Use a different colored nametag to identify newcomers so all can welcome them.
- **Spotlight a new member at each meeting.** Ask them to share their story (where they were born, how long have they lived in this area, hobbies and family). This icebreaker will build relationships between members.
- **Recruiting new members and sustaining membership** is not a job for one person. Membership growth and development is every member’s responsibility.
- **Establish an online presence** with a website, a Facebook page or other social media site to communicate council information to attract possible members who are active online and might have limited time to attend meetings.
- **Publicize service projects and their outcomes and results** in the church bulletin, parish newsletter, parish and council websites, or your organization’s newsletters. Success attracts new members!
- **Publicize meetings and events in the church bulletin and your social media site.** Give complete information as to location, time, speaker, and a contact name and e-mail address or telephone number for questions.
- **Plan a special meeting or luncheon to install your new officers.** They will feel more a part of the organization. It’s also important to recognize past accomplishments and those who have given of their time and talents. You may also want to announce your Catholic Woman of the Year during this event.
- **Conventions renew interest!** Encourage your members to attend. Announce the convention details in your parish bulletin and social media site. Invite Catholic women from non-affiliated parishes to attend and learn about the benefits of membership in a Council of Catholic Women. Become a mentor! Remember, educating all Catholic women is part of our mission!

SOUTH CAROLINA COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN STATE PROJECT

GIFT BOXES FOR POOR CHILDREN



Our project for the state this year is **Boxes of Joy**. We are asking all Deanery Presidents to engage all Affiliate Presidents along with their parishioners in this worthy project.

Cross Catholic Outreach is a ministry that serves the poorest of the poor in developing countries by channeling aid through Catholic missionaries. Just as we collaborate with Catholic ministries around the world, we are looking forward to collaborating with you to serve the poor through the Box of Joy ministry.

Your designated Project Leader will sign up on the Cross Catholic website listed below. Supplies will be shipped to her in late August. Your Project Leader will distribute the gift boxes and you will fill them with toys, small items of clothing, and school supplies. We also ask that you include a short, personal note which will bless these children and leave a lasting impression for years to come. For each Box of Joy, please include \$9 in the envelope provided. This covers \$7 S&H from Drop-off Center to the child's country, and \$2 to support the life-saving ministries of those working with the children. The boxes will be collected and delivered to a deanery drop-off location in your area for further collection and shipping to their final destination.

- Each affiliate is to assign a Group Leader and each deanery a Deanery Project Leader. Please have your leader work with the priest, other parish organizations and parishioners in getting everyone involved.
- Go to www.CrossCatholic.org/BoxOfJoy to sign up.
- When you sign up, you will receive a welcome kit and all the materials and instructions to get started.
- Make sure to announce the project in your church bulletins and on your social media sites with complete information, including the contact information of the person in charge for questions.

The Structure of the National Council of Catholic Women

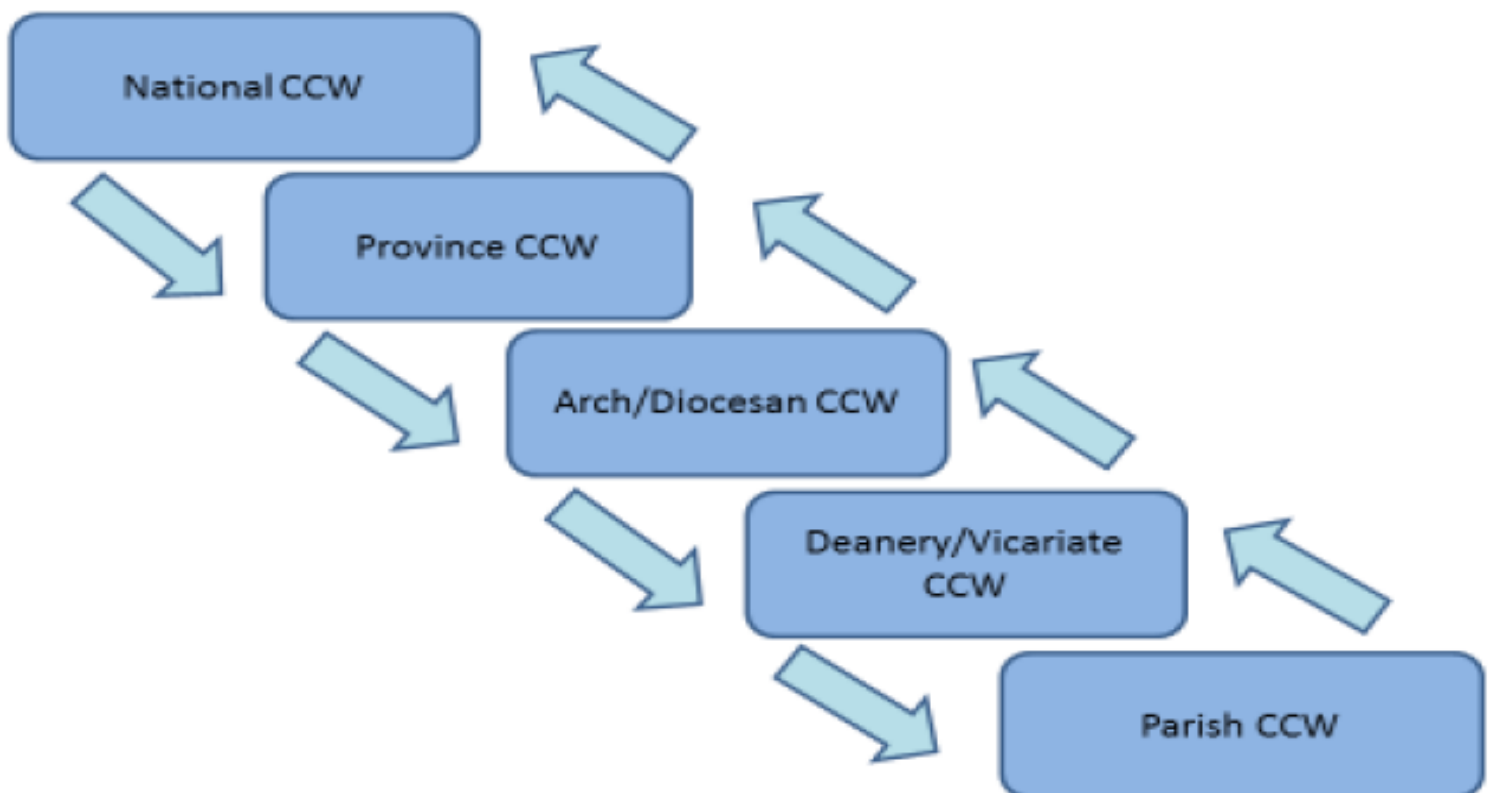
PARISH COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN: Parishes are started by the local Bishop as needed. The Parish CCW is often referred to as the “Affiliate”. The Parish Affiliate is the foundation of the structure.

DEANERY (VICARIATE, DISTRICT) COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN: This is the only structure that is called by different names. The Bishop decides how many deaneries are in his diocese. This is a geographic breakdown so priests and CCW can meet on a smaller level due to sizes of dioceses.

ARCH/DIOCESAN COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN: The Holy Father in Rome decides when and where new dioceses will be established.

PROVINCE: There are 33 Provinces in the United States. Provinces are geographical breakdowns decided by The Holy Father in Rome. This is a civil corporation and operational secretariat through which the Bishops, in cooperation with the other members of the Church, act on a wider-than-ecclesiastical scale for the good of the Church and society in the United States. We elect or appoint Province Directors to be the NCCW Board of Directors.

THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN is the umbrella organization for ALL Catholic Women’s Organizations. It was started in 1920 by the Bishops of the United States to bring all women’s organizations under one umbrella to be a powerful voice for Catholic Women in society and church.
