## South Carolina Council of Catholic Women 2024 Resolution

## **Belief in the Real Presence in the Eucharist**

**Purpose:** To increase understanding of the church's teaching on Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist.

**Whereas:** The 2<sup>nd</sup> Vatican Council taught that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of Christian life."

**Whereas:** The result of a Pew study in 2019 found that 69% of Catholics believe bread and wine are symbols while only 31% of Catholics believe the Eucharist is the body and blood of Christ.

**Whereas:** A follow up study in 2023 administered by Georgetown's Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate found that 2/3 of adult Catholics in the U.S. believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. (Catholic News Agency)

**Whereas:** The United States Council of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) adopted in 2022 a three-year Eucharistic Revival to renew a living relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist at all levels of the church in our country. (*This Is My Body: A Call to Eucharist Revival*)

**Whereas:** A personal encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist brings healing, grace and strength to share with others.

**Be it Resolved,** That members reinvigorate the Church through support of the USCCB National Eucharistic Revival.

**Resolved:** That members utilize the National Council of Catholic Women (NCCW) Spirituality Commission study guide "On the Eucharist in its Relationship to the Church" and promote this study. (NCCW: Spirituality and Reflection)

**Resolved:** That affiliates encourage liturgical and devotional practices around the Eucharist such as Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament as well as Daily Mass.
